



## Bib cards and information note cards

**Bibliography Cards** are the small 3X5 cards that record information about a source. The format of a bibliography card should match the MLA works cited form.

A	<p>Every Bib card will have a different letter to identify the source</p> <p>Refer to the MLA works cited entries for bib card forms. Always indent every line after the first line.</p> <p>It would be useful to you to record where you found this source so you can return to it if needed.</p>

**Note Cards** are the 4X6 cards that record information from a source. The information on these cards will be used to form the backbone of your paper (all the concrete details).

- r Note cards will only have ONE idea on them. Every piece of information (even if it is from the same page of a source) will have a separate card.
- r Note cards need GOOD, USEFUL information; you will not receive credit for note cards that have impertinent information.
- r Note cards can be written as direct quotes or paraphrases. NOTE- direct quotes make the best note cards because you can always change a direct quote on a note card into a paraphrase in your project.

<p>Love maps – role of anima and animus</p> <p style="text-align: right;">A 1</p> <p>“Other psychologists call this object choice a projection. According to Jungian psychology, the projection springs from an archetypal source as part of each soul’s intimate essence. For Jungians, the love map has highly individualized features, because it is a complex image in the heart that brings about the “fall” and the feeling that this is a call of fate. The more obsessive and compelling the image, the more madly in love you become, which intensifies the conviction that indeed fate is calling. Jungians name this archetypal factor that skews the love map toward a particular person, the anima and animus.”</p> <p>(Hillman 141)</p>	<p>Every note card will have a letter and a number. The letter will match the Bib card identifying the source from which this information was taken. Every card will have a different number to help keep them logged.</p> <p>The information taken from the source will be accurately recorded on the card. Remember to properly use quotation marks, ellipsis, etc. as needed.</p>
<p>Each note card will have a “slug” to help you quickly identify what kind of information is on the card.</p>	
<p>To make it easy for you later, have the author and page number on every note card so your correct paper documentation is already in place.</p>
